Currently, there is 61% of the 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> grade students who have achieved adequate growth on the Reading Assessment, an increase of 5% over the previous. There is 60% who have achieved adequate growth on the Mathematics Assessment, an increase of 9% over the previous year. This puts these grades on target to meet the end of year goal.
